Mission Statement

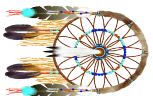

We encourage the men to get to know the character of God and who He created them to be. It is out of this identity and the grace of God that we can overcome the bondage of addiction

Each morning begins with a time of Praise & Worship around the drum.

- * Navajo Reading—Understanding of the Navajo written language.
- * Nutrition—Benefits of healthy eating habits.
- * Inner Healing—Deals with the psychological and emotional aspects of addiction.
- * Wild at heart—Who we are in Christ.
- * Personal Finances—Being good stewards of that which God gives us.
- * Manhood/Public Speaking—Walking and talking as a Godly man.
- * Life Skills—Learning people skills.
- * Community work projects—Allowing the men to give back to the community.
- * Convicted By Christ—Men's accountability group at World Harvest Church.
